

FAQs

1.) Will existing net metering customers be affected by this policy?

A: Existing NEM customers will remain on the current tariff for 20 years from the date of their original interconnection. After the 20-year term expires, they will be transitioned to the successor tariff.

2.) Why is BVES making changes to its NEM program?

A: While BVES is not obligated to have a NEM successor tariff once it reaches its limit, BVES wants to continue providing a service that promotes renewable distributed generation while ensuring costs of service remain equitable for all BVES.

3.) When will the successor tariff take effect?

A: BVES is currently working with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) to determine the final details and timing of the NEM Successor Tariff.

4.) Is BVES following the NEM changes being implemented by SCE, PG&E, SDG&E?

A: "NEM 2.0" is the successor tariff that was required by state legislation (AB-237) and only applies to large-scale utilities with more than 100,000 customers.
